Sample Facilitation Guide (Coach or Admin-Led)

Session 1 – Set the Foundation

- Watch: Introduction + Lesson 1
- **Prompt**: What makes a strong objective? How do ours compare?
- Workbook Activity: Analyze and revise lesson objectives
- Action: Identify a lesson to revise using the backward design process

Session 2 - Measure What Matters

- Watch: Lesson 2
- Prompt: Are our assessments truly aligned to our objectives?
- Workbook Activity: Evaluate summative and formative assessments
- Action: Redesign an assessment using backward design

Session 3 - Design for Learning

- Watch: Lesson 3 + So, What's Next?
- **Prompt**: Are our activities moving students toward mastery or just filling time?
- Workbook Activity: Map out a revised lesson sequence using the three-part strategy
- Action: Submit PDP and share reflections as a team

Sample 3-Week Professional Learning Plan

Week 1 – Crafting Objectives

- Focus: Clarity and measurability
- Activity: Revise objectives from a recent lesson
- Deliverable: Submit revised objective + rationale

Week 2 – Designing Assessments

- Focus: Alignment and integrity of measurement
- Activity: Evaluate or build an assessment aligned to the objective
- Deliverable: Submit assessment with scoring rubric and alignment notes

Week 3 - Building the Experience

- Focus: Instructional sequence, checks for understanding, and differentiation
- Activity: Create or revise lesson plan using the three-part framework
- Deliverable: Submit PDP worksheet + annotated lesson plan
