Sample Facilitation Guide (Admin or Coach-Led)

Session 1 – Why This Moment Matters

- Watch: Introduction + Lesson 1
- Prompt: What does AI mean for engagement, attention, and opportunity in schools?
- Workbook Activity: Complete the K-W-L chart and "Two Sigma" reflection
- Action: Identify a current instructional or operational challenge that AI could help address

Session 2 - Understand the Machine

- Watch: Lesson 2
- **Prompt**: How does understanding bias in Al help us better serve students?
- Workbook Activity: Conduct a personal bias exercise + review "soccer" case

Action: Evaluate 2 current classroom or district tools for AI use and ethics

Session 3 – Putting AI to Work

- Watch: Lesson 3 + So, What's Next?
- **Prompt**: What makes a tool meaningful, relevant, and responsible in learning?
- Workbook Activity: Explore and reflect on Magic School, Curipod, or SchoolAl
- **Action**: Complete PDP task (lesson, audit, or micro-training)

Sample 3-Week Professional Learning Plan

Week 1 – Al Awareness and Urgency

- Focus: The Hinge of History
- Activity: Reflect on current beliefs, tools, and habits
- Deliverable: Self-assessment + opportunity scan

Week 2 - Ethics, Bias, and Safeguards

- Focus: Understanding AI mechanics and implications
- Activity: Conduct an AI audit of current instructional or operational tools
- Deliverable: Summary of findings + recommended safeguards

Week 3 – Al in Action

- Focus: Classroom and leadership applications
- Activity: Use one tool to improve planning, assessment, or instruction
- Deliverable: PDP worksheet + project artifact (lesson plan, PD slides, etc.)
